MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR

Dufferin Community Foundation continues on a trajectory of rapid growth, thanks to the support and trust of our donors. Our permanently invested funds grew by over a million dollars in 2022, reaching \$2.5 million. That puts us at 25% of our stated goal of \$10 million in invested funds within our first 10 years of operation.

For investors, 2022 will not be remembered fondly, to say the least. We feel fortunate that we outperformed the general markets, though not enough to provide positive returns for the year. Our donors felt strongly about helping to fill the growing needs of our charities, and generously stepped up to ensure that in 2023 we would be able to continue to provide support.

We appreciate the trust that creators of our first three funds have put in the Foundation. Each one of these families donated additional money in 2022, building their funds to have an even larger impact on causes they care about in Dufferin County. We also welcomed four new donor funds last year, including a new family fund, the W. & M. Edelbrock Fund.

Since inception in 2018, the Foundation has flowed \$299,530 by way of more than 55 grants to 28 local charities across Dufferin. That includes distribution of funds from the federal government, RBC Foundation and corporations like Enbridge, which have entrusted us to disburse their charitable funds locally. We will continue to increase our ability to make grants as we grow, thanks to your support.

We also were able to have a little fun in 2022 too! Who can forget An Evening Under the Stars in June at the beautiful property of Joan and Paul Waechter? That was followed in July by the Jim Cuddy Jamboree in Mulmur. And in September, a Mulmur supporter donated the proceeds of a chamber music event to our Arts & Culture Fund.

As I complete my term as founding Chair of the Board, I have been reflecting on the journey that has gotten us to where we are today. From soliciting donations from our Founders Circle members to pay for start-up costs, to making grants that have a significant positive impact on local charities and the people they serve, all within five years.

GRANTING FUNDS FOR IMPACT NOW

Every year that we grow means more earned income from our charitable investments to support vital and critical programs in our community.

In 2022, we allocated more than \$40,000 to local charities. The community impact ranged from expanded mental health programs for youth, to teaching refugees to grow farm-fresh food, to ensuring the voices of neurodiverse actors can be heard on stage. We are constantly awed by the commitment to make life better in Dufferin County, and we thank the local charities and their staff who are mission-driven to help.

Local businesses doubled the "boost"

Five charities and collaborations received Booster Grants in 2022, each one sponsored by a local business person who contributed the full amount of the grant. Helping vulnerable residents post-pandemic

Four charities that are focused on enhancing mental health and shelter/housing services received \$13,000 in Dufferin Emergency Support Fund (DESF) grants in 2022. The DESF was created to provide extra support during emergency periods. This year's grants program was made possible by the generosity of Enbridge Gas and donors from the community.
